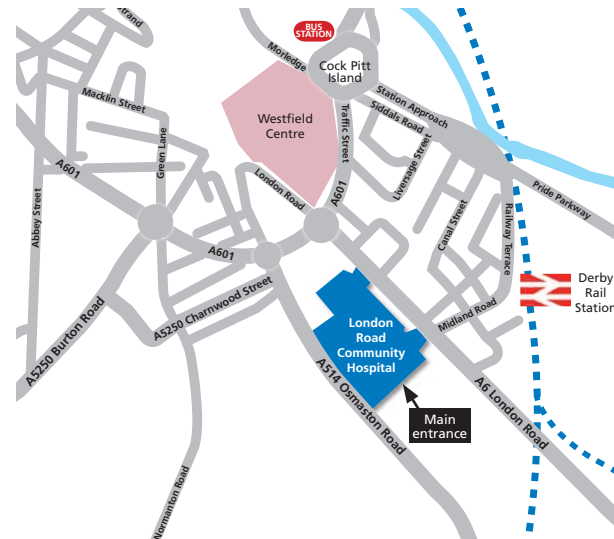

- STI screening
- Free confidential advice
- Professional and non-judgemental attitude
- Free treatment as required
- Free condoms and lubricant



Taking pride in caring

Services offered:

- Full sexual health screen
- Quick check clinic available for those with no symptoms
- Free condoms and lubrication
- Psychology service
- Sexual health advice and support
- Pregnancy testing (as part of a full screen if required)
- Emergency contraception
- Hepatitis B vaccination for people who are at risk of catching the virus sexually
- Post exposure prophylaxis (PEP) for people exposed to HIV

Everyone is welcome:

- All ages
- All genders
- All cultures and backgrounds
- All sexual orientations

All information is kept confidentially within the department.

Interpreters can be booked upon request.

Please inform reception if an interpreter is required.

What happens in Genito-Urinary Medicine?

- No appointment is needed, just drop in.
- You will be asked some personal questions. We ask everyone the same questions.
- Please don't be embarrassed and be as truthful as possible with your answers.
- All information is kept in confidence and you will be seen by a trained and non-judgemental professional.
- Some tests may be carried out while you wait with some results and treatments available straight away.
- A health advisor is available in the clinic to explain about your tests and give advice on sexual health.

Why get tested

You should come to us if you have any concerns at all. Some infections have no symptoms and can cause lasting damage to your body such as infertility. You should also get tested between partners and regularly if you are in a long term relationship.

But I'm embarrassed

Some people do feel embarrassed but the people you'll see won't be. Sexual health workers see lots of different people everyday. It is their job to help you and also to treat you respectfully and with sensitivity. We have experienced male and female staff who can advise you in a non-judgemental way.

Infections tested for:

- Chlamydia
- Gonorrhoea
- HIV
- Syphilis
- HEP B
- Thrush
- HEP C
- Herpes
- Warts
- Non-specific Urethritis (NSU)
- Bacterial Vaginosis (BV)
- Trichomonas Vaginalis (TV)

Protect yourself from most sexually transmitted infections by using condoms every time you have sex - vaginal, oral and anal.
